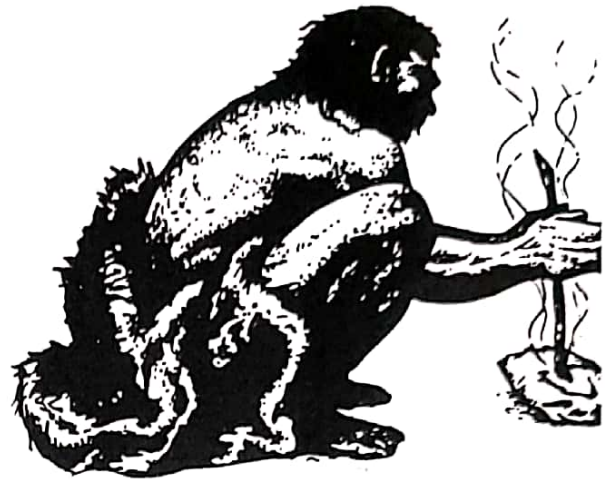

Thousands of years ago in the Ice Age, tribes⁽¹⁾ of hunters lived in caves. These caves were often on the sunny side⁽²⁾ of a valley. A fire would be lit at the entrance for warmth or to keep wild animals⁽³⁾ away. We think they learnt to make fire by rubbing sticks⁽⁴⁾ together or making sparks with stones. Before this they probably used fire⁽⁵⁾ accidentally caused by lightning to start their own.



These prehistoric people didn't know how to grow crops⁽⁶⁾ for food; they ate wild plants and berries. They also hunted wild animals like bears, reindeer, mammoths for meat⁽⁷⁾ and skins. They made simple tools and axe heads weapons⁽⁸⁾ from flint. This was a kind of stone which split into pieces⁽⁹⁾ when struck with another rock or a hammer made from deer antlers.

Drawings, whole skeletons and artefacts found in caves⁽¹⁰⁾ tell us a lot about these ancient hunters.
